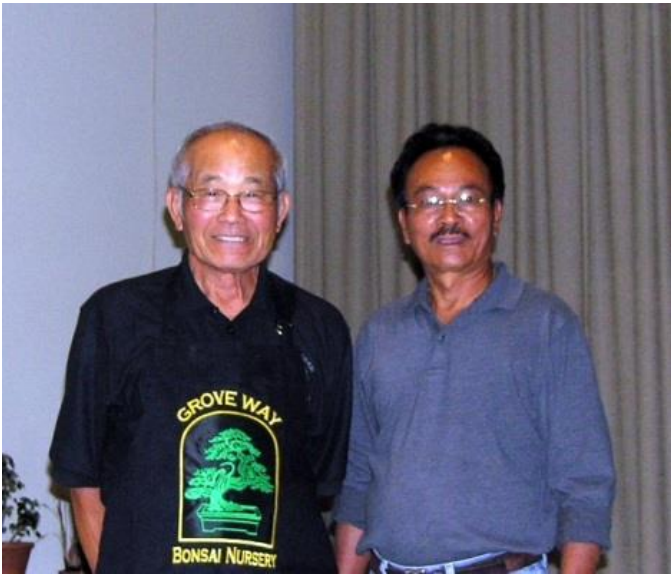

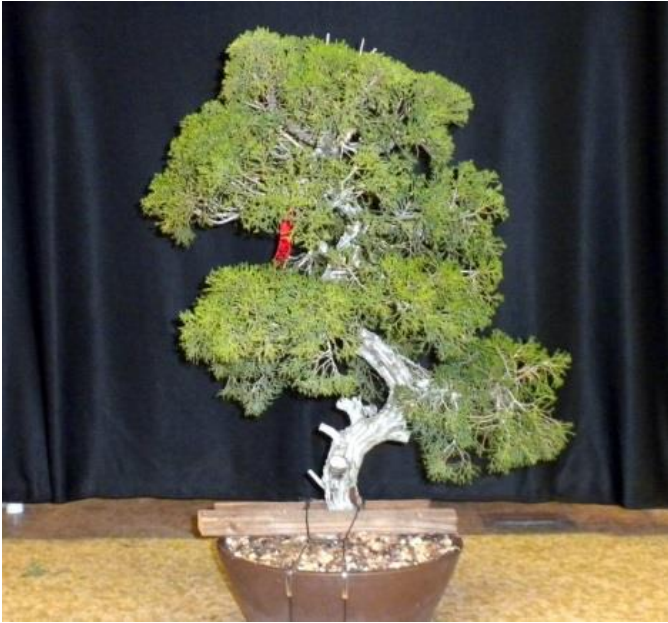

BONSAI BASIC

During November our trees here in Northern California begin the transition to dormancy. I use “transition” lightly as it does not get real cold here in our SF Bay Area. The general rule at this time of the year is to guard against conditions that could prompt a second growth. It does not happen often where we get really warm days at this time of the year.

Trees require less water now. There is need to check your trees daily or every other day and the goal is to not let your trees dry out. This applies to the entire winter or dormancy period.

It’s time to clean up. Remove dead leaves and needles on your trees and in and around your pots and shelves.

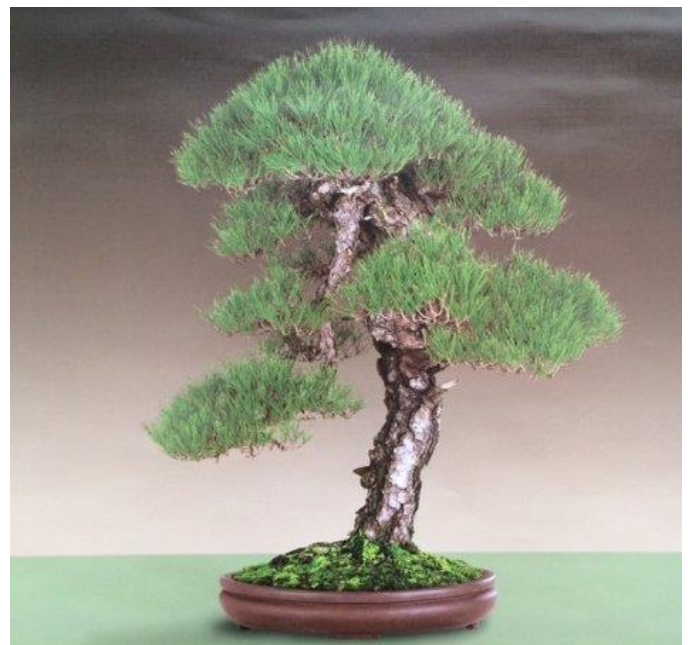
For pines, during the next six weeks or so, clean up and remove all needles that have tip burn, and the ugly and extra-long second year needles. It is time to execute your fall cleanup of old and yellow needles and to balance the strength of any remaining needles per branch.

Never drastically trim a pine that is in weak or poor condition.

You need to understand where your tree is in the branch *Ramification Cycle* to understand how much and where to prune your two-needle pines. If you have weak zones on your trees (usually the bottom 1/3), you need to leave more needles (and some of the older needles) to balance its strength and to gain strength. In the stronger or upper region of the tree, you can remove more needles. This balances the strength for next year’s growth.

One of the hardest lessons on Pines is the Fall bud removal. It’s sometimes hard to write so ask questions or let’s have a workshop!! I will bring examples to this month’s meeting.

Ultimately, you want to leave buds on the side shoots that elongated on the branch from your late May candle cutting. Remove any bottom or on top buds/candles/shoots. The best configuration is a pair of good strength shoots on each side of a branch. This is how you achieve a pad of foliage over subsequent years (3 to 5 years).

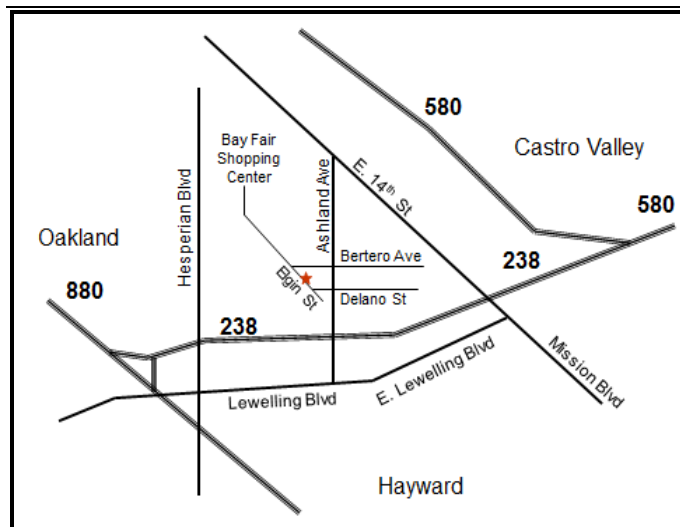
